Dr. Henry "Hank" Jann

Dr. Jann an Associate Professor of Equine Surgery at the Oklahoma State University Center for Veterinary Health Sciences. He obtained his DVM from Cornell University....

Dr. Parkinson received his BS in Wildlife Biology from Colorado State University in 1978, in 1981 he obtained his MS in Physiology from CSU. After receiving his DVM from CSU in 1982, two years later he opened Mobile Veterinary Clinic in Durango, CO. He has owned and was the Medical Director of Riverview Animal Hospital, an AAHA certified clinic. Dr. Parkinson was a FRANK communications coach in 2008. He takes special interest in pain management, anesthetic safety and dentistry, leadership, communication and team building...

Dr. Dale Grotelueschen

Dr. Dale Grotelueschen is a managing veterinarian with the Beef Cattle Veterinary Operations team, Pfizer Animal Health. 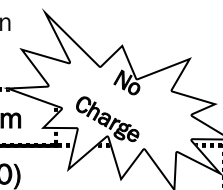
