

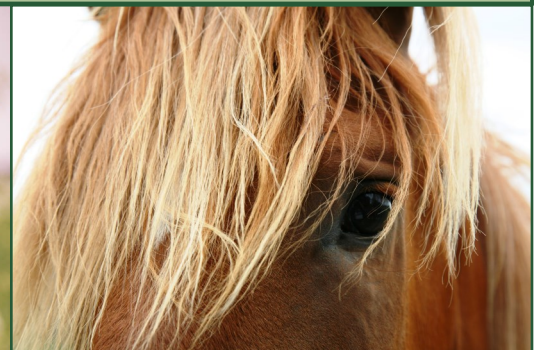

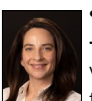
SMALL ANIMAL SPEAKERS

James Gregory Burns, DVM, DACT - Colorado State University - Fort Collins, CO



- **The Breeding Female and Neonate Care** - This is a very broad lecture topic and first focuses on pre-breeding considerations in the bitch, followed by basics of neonate care – birth to 3 weeks of age.
- **Small Animal Reproductive Emergencies** - This lecture discusses reproductive related emergencies in the bitch that GP veterinarians see in routine practice. It is a clinical lecture and organized by presentation, etiopathogenesis, clinical signs, diagnosis and treatment.
- **Pregnancy, Parturition and Dystocia** - This lecture includes basics of canine and feline pregnancy and parturition. It finishes with clinical diagnosis and management of dystocia in both species.

Raena Furtado, DVM - IDEXX - Centennial, CO



- **Fecal Antigen: Hookworm, Roundworm, Whipworm and Tapeworm** - We will discuss in this lecture why we perform fecal testing. Review traditional methods of fecal testing. Highlight the advances in technology of fecal testing, and how this technology will improve your results. We will take some time to discuss fecal testing. Lastly, we will review Giardia testing guidelines according to CAPC.

Tamara Grubb, DVM, PhD, DACVAA - International Veterinary Academy of Pain Management - Uniontown, WA



- **Stop the Suffering! Treatment Options for Chronic Pain** - Chronic pain, like most chronic diseases, can be very difficult to effectively treat. The pathology that makes chronic pain different from acute pain will be reviewed. New analgesic options and alternative therapies, both pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic, will be discussed.
- **What are They Hiding? Pain Assessment in Dogs and Cats** - Animals have a strong evolutionary instinct to hide pain, yet the fact that they feel pain can be scientifically evidenced and the adverse effects of pain occur whether they show their pain or not. Tools used to assess pain will be discussed and demonstrated.
- **My Favorite Local Anesthetic Blocks: Which One(s) Can You Infiltrate in YOUR practice?** Local anesthetics are one of the most powerful analgesic classes available. Most of the blocks are easy to do and the drugs are cost-effective. Useful blocks that can be used in any practice will be described and demonstrated via video.
